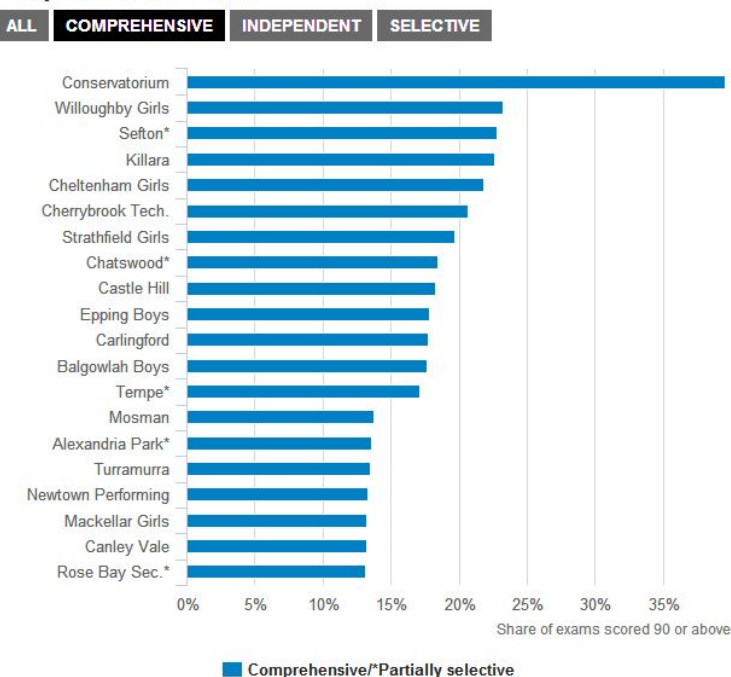

The school is now at its largest since the 80's, with 720 students. We employed 9 new permanent staff through 2015, 7 through the merit selection process. We have now been allocated an additional Head Teacher to the school. The new head teacher is provided subsequent to a review period. The acting position for 2016 will be Head Teacher Wellbeing and there is currently a selection process taking place.

The first P&C Meeting for the year was held this week and it wonderful to have so many parents attend. The committee has been very active in recent years and it has already put organisation in place for Trivia Night and a number of other fund raising activities.

A new initiative for 2016 will be "Bushlink", a community-based organisation which brings trainees into the school to work with students and parents to regenerate native vegetation and landscape the school grounds – we certainly could use this type of support! Emma Puddicombe has graciously agreed to co-ordinate the program, our first visit from Bushlink will be Wednesday 2 March, so if anyone is available to help on the day, could they please contact the school via our email and we will pass the information on to Emma.

We are again experiencing difficulties with buses this year. I have contacted Transport NSW and the Transport Minister to notify of the urgent need for increased space on buses. The school has doubled in size in the last 10 years and no extra buses have been provided. I would appreciate parents contacting the 131500 number to communicate any issues that arise with their sons being unable to gain access to buses or unable to arrive at school on time. The more contacts made, the greater the chance of some change.

Deputy Principal Report

Year 7

Year 7 have started their time at Balgowlah Boys Campus with great enthusiasm. Their teachers have been very impressed with the students' organisation and readiness for high school. Year 7 have quickly become part of the school and have been strongly supported by their Year 10 Peer Mentors and staff. On their first day, I reminded students to make their time count at Balgowlah Boys Campus. Year 9

It has been very encouraging to see Years 9 students taking up the are many opportunities to develop their leadership skills through involvement in peer tutoring, music ensembles, sporting teams, student representative council and societies such as chess, environment and Hall Crew. It is through these types of experiences that students achieve the focus and motivation to achieve highly in their academic studies.

Year 11

Throughout last year they took a lot of time to work with their teachers to identify a senior study pattern that would serve them best at the HSC. This was a good indication of the type of focus and attitude we would see this year. Our Year 11 boys have been using their time to study in the library and have also continued to be outstanding leaders for our school not only academically but also through their participation in co-curricular sport and ensembles, assembly presentations and uniform. This commitment to excellence will be reflected in their achievement across their senior years.

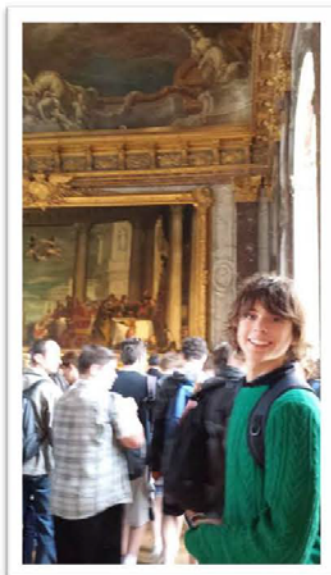

Day 3: Monday 26th September (B, D)

Paris is a magnificent city best explored on foot (and by using the Metro!). Enjoy a full day of sightseeing. Use your Paris Metro card to discover this enchanting city, entrance to the Musée du Louvre and Musée de

l'Orangerie included. Overnight: Paris



Day 4: Tuesday 27th September (B)

Breakfast at the hotel After breakfast, meet your English speaking guide at your hotel and take the metro and the RER (ticket included) to go Versailles. Visit the Palace and the gardens in Versailles during your half day excursion there. Return to Paris in the afternoon and stop at the Eiffel Tower for an independent visit of this monument (ticket to 3rd level included). Overnight: Paris

Day 5: Wednesday 28th September (B, D)

Breakfast at the hotel After breakfast, meet your private coach and depart for Amiens. Stop en route in Compiègne (Armistice Wagon) and in Fromelles to see the Memorial and the VC Corner. Continue onto Amiens and check in at your hotel. Overnight: Amiens

Day 6: Thursday 29th September (B, L, D)

Breakfast at the hotel Depart for a full day excursion in Somme. Sightseeing includes visit of the Villers-Bretonneux (Franco- Australian museum, Australian memorial and Adelaide Cemetery) and the Albert (Somme 1916 museum). Lunch is included today. Transfer back to Amiens at the end of the day. Dinner will be at a local restaurant in Amiens. Overnight: Amiens

Day 7: Friday 30th September (B)

Breakfast at the hotel Transfer from Amiens to Ypres. Stop en route in Peronne to visit the Historical de la Grande Guerre and in Fromelles to see the Memorial and VC Corner. Upon arrival, check into your hotel in Ypres. Overnight: Ypres

Day 8: Saturday 1st October (B)

Breakfast at the hotel In the morning, meet your private coach at the hotel and depart for a full day excursion in Ypres. You will visit the Flanders Field museum and stop at the village of Zonnebeke. In the evening, attend the memorial service at Menin Gate. Overnight: Ypres

Day 9: Sunday 2nd October (B, D)

Breakfast at the hotel Transfer to Caen by coach this morning. Before arriving in Caen, you will visit Dunkerque and the Omaha Beach with the American



cemetery. Arrive in Caen later this afternoon, dinner at a local restaurant. Overnight: Caen

Day 10: Monday 3rd October (B, D)

Breakfast at the hotel After breakfast, you will depart for a full day excursion in Normandy including a short walking tour of the city, visit the Arromanches museum and Caen Peace Memorial. Return to your hotel later this afternoon. Dinner will be at a local restaurant. Overnight: Caen

Day 11: Tuesday 4th October (B)

Breakfast at the hotel Transfer to Paris via coach after

breakfast. En route, you will stop in the village of Giverny to visit Claude Monet's House and Gardens. After your arrival in Paris, check in to your hotel. Overnight: Paris

Day 12: Wednesday 5th October (B)

Breakfast at the hotel. After breakfast, use your metro pass and RER tickets to go to Disneyland. Spend your day in the park and return to your hotel at the end of the day. Overnight: Paris

Day 13: Thursday 6th October (B)

Breakfast at the hotel After breakfast, check out of your hotel and transfer to Charles de Gaulle International Airport for your flight home to Australia. Overnight: In transit

Day 14: Friday 7th October

Arrive in Sydney.

The tuition program is available for every student at Balgowlah Boys Campus. **No previous skill is required.**

It has been an active start to the year for our Drama students at Bally Boys, who have proven their flair for performance and team work, key outcomes for all students undertaking Drama.

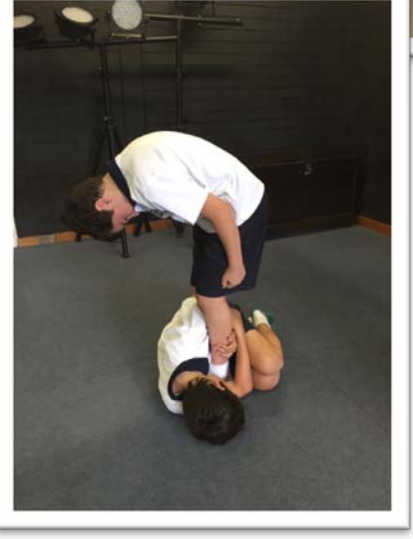
Our **Juniors in Years 7 and 8 Drama** have been getting to know each other and their performance spaces. They have begun engaging with new terminology, specific to drama and have had to respond creatively in a variety of scenarios. The focus of these sessions being: communication, cooperation and listening to one another. Skills our boys have excelled in at this early stage. They have been asked to focus on using their body to make a variety of shapes - the technique being Actors and Props - encouraging them to think spontaneously and critically to convey these objects with belief and conviction. We also took some time out to learn about one another, the boy's views on drama and interesting learned how they would sum their lives up in a movie title, to some comic effect.



Preliminary Drama students have an exciting few weeks ahead. These boys are off to the Seymour Centre to see *OnStage* and *Writers OnStage/ OnScreen*, a production driven by exemplary student works from the 2015 HSC from all project areas. Then the boys will travel to Walsh Bay to the Australia Theatre for Young People (ATYP) where they will be audience for *The Voices Project: All good Things*. A production compiled of monologues presented by young performers, relatable to our boys and explicit in their development in staging their own individual performances through the senior course.

These boys will review these productions reflecting on the production styles, techniques as well as the performance quality as a means of improving their own knowledge of the stage and performance. Since commencing Drama our seniors have improvised and had the opportunity to get to know one another. They have engaged in an array of performance techniques and are eager to take to the stage to enhance their skills. With such an eager and talented Preliminary cohort, our boys are sure to rise to the challenge of senior study. Keep it up boys!

Faculty of Arts: Introducing Drama Mr Montgomery

Having taught almost eight years at Model Farms High School in Sydney's West, I took on a number of important roles driving staff and student morale. I was a valued member of the welfare team, mentoring my year group from Years 10-12; I was in charge of the school's Speak Sports Program and also played a role in facilitating the Primary Links Program encouraging students from years 5-6 through drama exercises assisted by Year 10 mentors. I readily directed students in both scripted and self devised productions for parents and the wider school community; have been a tutor for the NSW Public School Junior Drama Ensemble for a number of years as well as an annual tutor at the NSW Public School State Drama Camp mentoring Year 11 students from around the state delivering workshops that cater to their senior studies in Drama. For the past two years I have had the privilege of being the festival coordinator for the *LightsUP* Drama Festival held annually at the Joan Sutherland Performing Arts Centre for students from K-12. I aim to encourage our enthusiastic and creative boys to work hard and respond collaboratively with an expectation to give our boys at Bally a broad range of performance opportunities and skills to assist them in achieving their personal best. As a new member of the Bally Boys teaching staff I am excited to be working with such a dynamic and enthusiastic staff.

VISUAL ARTS

Visual Arts in 2016 has begun what looks to be an exciting year for all Visual Arts students in 7-12 at Balgowlah Boys Campus. Rooms are a busy with activity and fabulous works are starting to take form.

Year 7 this term are undergoing a unit of work that explores the traditions of portraiture. Their realistic portrait drawings are underway, as students take into consideration portraiture conventions, including proportions of the face and shading and toning techniques. These drawings will eventuate into expressive portrait paintings later in the term.

Years 8 are in their preliminary stages of Flying Machine drawings and designs inspired by the notebooks of Leonardo da Vinci. They are currently working on some beautifully detailed drawings and will commence the construction of their Flying Machine Sculptures later in the year.

Year 9 students are currently in the initial stages of producing site-specific works of the Quarantine Station at North Head. Their works will be inspired by the surrounding landscapes as well as the journeys of people who were quarantined at the facility. Students will visit the site during Week 4 and will visit Manly Gallery in Week 5, and will undergo a series of excursions and workshops that will inform their artmaking, including artmaking sessions with renowned printmaker Ben Rak.

Year 10 are learning how to produce the reduction prints which communicate aspects of their everyday life. This printing process is particularly time consuming and complex, and we are looking forward to seeing the results later in the term.

Year 11 student have begun their Preliminary HSC course and have delved into self-directed works informed by their understanding of identity and the self.

Year 12 students are well into their second term of their HSC year. BOWs (Body of Works) are well and truly taking shape, and students will be attending an excursion to the White Rabbit Gallery during Week 9 which will inform their investigation of Asian Art. All in all, this term is gearing up to be a wonderfully productive and successful year for the students and teachers of Visual Arts at Balgowlah Boys Campus.
