



Our Coaches

Julien Prosser

Julien is a three time Australian Olympic representative in beach volleyball and 14-time Australian Open Champion. He has won more Australian National Titles and National Tour events than any other athlete (male or female) in the history of beach volleyball in Australia.

He started playing indoor volleyball at high school in Western Australia. During this time, he won three junior indoor Gold medals. Julien has been coaching junior volleyball athletes (beach and indoor) for nearly 20 years on the Northern Beaches and is now one of our Bally Volleyball Teams, Head Coaches



Kerri Pottharst

Kerri is a three time Australian Olympic representative. She won a Bronze Medal at the Atlanta Olympics in 1996 and a Gold Medal at the Sydney Olympics in 2000. The Sydney Olympic gold medal in beach volleyball is considered a major historic moment and has seen Kerri and

partner Natalie Cook immortalised on Bondi beach with a beautiful mural

Kerri has World Tour coaching experience including coaching the USA Number 3 women's team for the a season and the Belgium Number 1 women's team for a full season. Kerri has also taken part in various World, Australian, National tours and coached numerous Junior players at camps Australia and overseas. Kerri's coaching philosophy is "Repetition is the mother of



skill"

and "Strategy trumps physicality". She stresses the importance of practicing the basic foundation of passing and setting until it's consistent. Then she builds on that. Kerri says "Winning is a mindset".


Creative and Performing Arts



MUSIC CURRICULUM TEACHERS AND COORDINATORS

Mr Iain Robertson

Iain was a drummer in a professional rock band in the 90's and was signed to London Records and EMI Music Publishing. Iain then went on to study Music in the UK gaining degrees in Music Production at Newcastle College then a Music Education degree at London Metropolitan University. Iain started teaching in London and was in 2 different schools for 11 years between 2006 and 2017. Iain then moved to Australia with his young family and worked briefly in Emanuel school in Randwick. He then opted to come and work in the state system and he considers himself very fortunate to work at Balgowlah Boys. Iain is a multi-instrumentalist and considers himself a drummer first, but enjoys playing guitar, piano and trumpet. Iain is very passionate about rock and popular music and never stops talking about the Beatles.

Ms Eva Stokes

Since completing her Bachelor of Music Education with honours at UNSW where she gained accolades for her research into music pedagogy, Eva has been teaching at Balgowlah Boys since 2019. She has taken both Music 1 and Music 2 courses through the HSC with much success, channelling her knowledge and experience in performance, composition and musicology. Eva has a wealth of experience as a classical and jazz pianist, as well as a multi-instrumentalist who enjoys playing bass, drums and guitar. Eva is the main point of contact for the Band Program.

Mr Ben Corby

Ben completed a Bachelor of Contemporary Music at JMC Academy and a Master of Education at UNSW. From age 15 he has been performing regularly as a professional musician in original and cover bands across NSW. Ben has gained valuable experience in the music industry, recording in some of Sydney's top studios and developing his own skills as a music producer. Since starting at Balgowlah Boys in 2016, he has continued working as a professional musician which allows him to pass on current information and advice to students interested in a career in the music industry.

MUSIC CURRICULUM

Curriculum classes have commenced with a bang and the new Year 7 cohort are always excited to do Chair Drumming. This teaches the boys about rhythm and duration and they all learn how to play the drum kit and are able to play different rhythmic motifs. The boys all get really excited with this program and it challenges them to play in large groups in class and also gives them a chance to play the drum kit. Our boys (and teachers) all seem to enjoy this program.

Year 8 all learn guitar this term under the topic of Rock Music and our elective classes are stronger than ever with the biggest Year 9 cohort opting to take music with over 30 students in the elective stream.

All of our worksheets and tasks can be found on the schools curriculum Canvas pages. Each year group has their own area.

After our strongest HSC results last year (thanks to Ms Stokes and her excellent boys who got 40% band 6s) the Year 11 and 12 classes have an excellent basis to work from and we have two strong and talented classes in Stage 6. Hopefully we'll see some fantastic results this year as well. Last year's Year 12 set an excellent benchmark.

We are also hoping that a number of concerts will go ahead this year which will feature both the Band Program and curriculum work.





BAND PROGRAM

Our Band Program is well and truly in full swing, with rehearsals for all ensembles beginning this week. We offer a comprehensive Band Program that caters for instrumentalists of all skill levels and tastes. The school bands are involved in performances at school assemblies, awards days



and showcases, as well as external eisteddfods and festivals. The program assists students in reaching their musical goals, whilst refining their ensemble skills by having access to highly experienced teachers and conductors. We offer two comprehensive programs that are available to all students – the Concert Band Program and the Jazz Program.

- · Stage Band (all years, auditioned) Thursday, 7:30am in the Music Studio
- Jazz Orchestra (all years, auditioned) Friday, 7:30am in the Music Studio

All auditions for the Jazz Program are now completed - students who have successfully auditioned can check their position outside the CAPA Staffroom in G Block.

The Band Program welcomes musicians of all skill levels and backgrounds and aims to foster the enjoyment of playing music with peers.
